

Hypericum 'Pumpkin' $\odot \oplus$ Yellow Flowers, Orange Berries 3x3 Z8

Hypericum x inodorum (St. John's Wort) 'Pumpkin' - located in Steps Bed Zones 5-9 Bright Yellow Flowers followed by Glowing Orange Berries Full sun, part shade Semi-deciduous Shrub Easy Care Prune late fall or early spring before flower buds set 3'x3'

Buttercup yellow flowers are followed by glowing orange berries on these rust resistant plants. The dazzling fruit, popular in cut flower arrangements, is the main attraction. A fuss-free deciduous shrub ideal for borders and containers. Use as a specimen or low hedge, or plant in showy drifts.

The multi-stemmed shrub has an upright spreading habit of growth. Its relatively fine texture sets it apart from other landscape plants with less refined foliage. It is best pruned in late winter once the threat of extreme cold has passed and before new growth begins.

It prefers dry to average moisture levels with very well-drained soil and will often die in standing water. It is considered to be drought tolerant.

Prune to shape in early spring before flowers appear or after fruiting in the fall. Plants should not be pruned after flower buds are set.
