



Pineapple Broom ♥ 15x15 \\ Yellow Argyrocytisus battandieri

Pineapple or Moroccan Broom (*Argyrocytisus battandieri*) - Located in Pineapple Broom Bed Zones 7-10 Full sun Very Fragrant Bright Yellow Flowers Silky, Aromatic, Evergreen Foliage Large Shrub or Small Tree Tolerates Heat, Drought, Poor Soil and Regular Pruning Deer resistant 15'x15'

Pineapple or Moroccan Broom (Argyrocytisus battandieri) hails from the Atlas Mountains in Morocco. The tall shrub or small tree was named after French pharmacist and botanist, Jules Aimé Battandier, who was an authority on Algerian plants. It was introduced to European horticulture in 1922.

For many years, the plant was grown in greenhouses, as it was thought to be less hardy than has been recently shown. It is reliably hardy down to 0 degrees F. (-10° C.) and is best grown outdoors in full sun with shelter from cold winds.

Pineapple broom makes an excellent wall shrub. Its aromatic tripartite silvery grey semi-evergreen leaves feel silky. In summer, it is festooned with large, erect cone-shaped clusters of lemon-yellow Laburnum-like flowers emitting a distinctive pineapple scent, hence the name. It has a rounded habit and can reach 15 feet (4 m.) in height and spread. Fast growing, it may be pruned after flowering. Best with little irrigation after it is established. Benign neglect is appreciated.
