

Poppy 'Brilliant' Huge Scarlet-Orange Flowers 🌣 2x3 Z8

Papaver orientale 'Brilliant' - located in Palm Bed Zones 3-8 Salmon-Pink Flowers Full sun Herbaceous Perennial Acid, Neutral, Alkaline Soil 2'x3' Care-free Deer, Rabbit & Drought Tolerant Goes Dormant after Flowering in Late Spring Self-Seeds

Papaver orientale 'Brilliant' was made famous by New Mexico artist Georgia O'Keeffe's paintings. It blooms in late spring with huge scarlet-orange flowers and is an outstanding variety.

'Brilliant' is one of the most striking hardy poppies you can grow, this is the classic Oriental Poppy, with large, bright blood-red flowers with jet black centers - a real cottage garden jewel.

Oriental Poppies provide a cheerful display of huge, satiny flowers in late spring and early summer. Plants form a low clump of coarse, hairy leaves, and usually go dormant, disappearing completely by late summer. This strain has fiery scarlet-red blooms, with a black centre. Because they disappear in summer, plant something beside Oriental Poppies that will get bushy later in the season, such as Rudbeckia, Russian Sage, or fall-flowering grasses. Divide in August to September.
